Text 1: JOBS OF THE FUTURE

For many years, people have wondered what work will look like in the future. Although nobody can predict every change, most experts agree that technology will continue to change the workplace completely. Some traditional jobs may become less common, while completely new professions are likely to appear. Because of these changes, workers will need to adapt to new demands and continue developing their skills throughout their careers. The idea of having one job for life may become less common than it is today.

One area expected to grow rapidly is artificial intelligence (AI). While some people worry that smart computer systems will replace human workers, many specialists believe that technology will create jobs as well as remove some existing ones. For example, businesses may need professionals who can design, test, manage, and improve AI systems. There may also be opportunities for people who can train these systems by providing information and checking their results. In addition, companies will need experts who can make sure AI is used safely, fairly, and responsibly.

Environmental worries are also changing the job market. As governments and companies invest in cleaner energy sources, demand for workers in green and eco-friendly fields is increasing.

Engineers, environmental advisors, and green energy workers may play a more important role in the coming years. New jobs could also appear in areas such as recycling, using energy efficiently, and green building design. As countries try to reduce pollution and slow climate change, these professions are likely to become increasingly valuable.

Another major trend is the growing importance of people skills. Technical knowledge remains important, but employers are also looking for people who can communicate clearly, solve problems, think creatively, and work well with others. Since machines can perform many everyday, repetitive tasks, human qualities such as adaptability, understanding feelings, and leadership may become even more valuable. Workers who can combine technical abilities with strong communication skills are likely to be especially successful.

Learning throughout life is expected to become a normal part of professional life. Instead of relying only on certificates and degrees gained at the start of their careers, workers may need to update their knowledge regularly. Online courses, workplace training, and independent study can help people keep up with changing requirements. Many employees may even change careers several times during their working lives.

Although nobody knows exactly what the future will bring, one thing seems certain: flexibility and a willingness to learn will play a very important role in career success. People who are open to change and ready to develop new skills are likely to have the best opportunities in the years ahead.

Text 2: REWILDING: GIVING NATURE A SECOND CHANCE

In many parts of the world, natural areas have changed a lot because of human activity. Forests have been cut down, rivers have been moved, and large areas of land have been used for farming, industry, or housing. While these changes have often brought financial benefits, they have also reduced the variety of plants and animals and put pressure on many species. In response to these problems, a growing environmental movement known as *rewilding* has become popular in recent years.

Rewilding is the process of fixing natural ecosystems and allowing them to live and grow with less human control. Instead of carefully managing every part of an environment, nature protectors aim to create conditions where nature can recover on its own. This may involve planting local trees and plants, restoring wet areas, or bringing back animal species that once lived in an area.

One well-known example comes from several European countries, where animals like beavers have been brought back to areas where they had disappeared centuries ago. Beavers build dams that slow the flow of water, creating wetlands that support a wide variety of plants, insects, birds, and fish. As a result, these animals can have a positive effect on entire natural areas.

Supporters of rewilding argue that healthy ecosystems provide many benefits for people as well as wildlife. Forests absorb carbon dioxide from the air, helping to reduce the impact of climate change. Wetlands can lower the risk of flooding by storing extra water during periods of heavy rain. In addition, natural areas often attract tourists, creating business opportunities for local communities.

However, rewilding also has some disagreements. Some farmers are worried that the return of certain animals could damage crops or harm their farm animals. Others worry that reducing human management may lead to unexpected environmental problems. For this reason, rewilding projects often require careful planning and teamwork between environmental groups, local people, scientists, and government authorities.

Despite these worries, interest in rewilding continues to grow. Researchers are studying the long-term effects of different projects, while governments and conservation groups are investing money

to restore natural habitats. Although rewilding is not a solution to every environmental problem, many experts believe it can play an important role in protecting wildlife and improving the health of nature in the future.
